Zoppe' Family Circus Coming to Wheat Ridge!

Reserve a date on your calendar to attend the Zoppe' Italian Circus at Anderson Park starting on August 17, 2012 through August 26, 2012. Discussions were held with the Carnation Festival Board to determine if the circus could be added to the Carnation Festival activities as its signature event. The Board unanimously voted to support the event and to work with the City to ensure its success.

The Zoppe' Circus was founded in 1842 in Venice, Italy by Napoleone Zoppe' and his wife Ermengilda. Napoleon's great-grandson, Alberto Zoppe' inherited the Circus almost 100 years later. The Zoppe's offer an "unapologetically authentic, one-ring circus where you will sit on wood-plank bleachers and enjoy the great traditions of circus."

The Circus is scheduled to present fifteen performances and tickets will be sold for \$15.00 each and coupons will be distributed to discount this price to \$10.00. Note from the Tax Department: Tickets to the Zoppe' Family Circus in August are exempt from the four percent admissions tax because it is sponsored by the City and located on City property (Anderson Park). Tickets for rides and amusements at the Carnation Festival happening at the same time are also exempt from the admissions tax for the same reasons. All other sales of food, beverages and goods at the festival and the circus' featured authentic Italian marketplace are subject to the usual sales tax. 38th AVENUE CORRIDOR PLAN

The City is moving forward with key recommendations in the 38th Avenue Corridor Plan. One major implementation step is restriping the street into a three-lane section—often referred to as a “road diet.” Between Upham and Depew Streets, the road will be restriped so that there is one thru-lane in each direction and one continuous center turn lane.
