Who Do You Brake For?

That’s the question the City of Wheat Ridge and other metro area



municipalities are asking this summer.

Earlier this summer, Wheat Ridge City Council passed a proclamation in support of the "Brake for Bela" safe summer driving campaign that aims to combat the seasonal increase in vehicle/pedestrian accidents.

- **Business of the Year** – This award recognizes a business that exemplifies the values of our community (aka the ‘Best in Business.’)
- **Reinvestment Award** – This award recognizes a business that has demonstrated one or more of the following: made a significant investment in its property, improved the overall appearance of the site, maintained property at the highest standards, or updated their building in a manner to make it more marketable.
- **Cultural Commission Award** – This award recognizes a business which has made an impact on our community through one or more of the following: promoting/encouraging culture and the arts, promoting awareness of our cultural activities, diversity, heritage, supporting opportunities in art education for all ages or incorporating art into the architecture and design of their building.
- **City Council’s Partnership Award** – This award gives the City Council an opportunity to recognize a company for their overall contributions to the City. It incorporates criteria from all award categories as well as contributions in volunteerism, leadership and community investment/involvement.
- **Mayor’s Business and Youth Partnership Award** – This award gives the Mayor an opportunity to recognize a company for their overall contributions. It incorporates criteria from all award categories as well as contributions in volunteerism, leadership and community investment, but must also include involvement with the mentoring, training, and partnering with youth.

Anyone wishing to nominate a Wheat Ridge business for an award this year should go to the Economic Development page of the City’s website at www.ci.wheatridge.co.us to print a nomination form. Forms are also available at City Hall, the Public Library and the Recreation Center. All nominations for the Annual Business Awards Program must be received by Friday, September 2, 2011. News from the City's Sales Tax Department: Automated Clearing House (ACH) Tax Payments Off to a Robust Start

On July 1, the City of Wheat Ridge introduced online ACH debit payments to complement the online tax filing program. For the first half of the month, which does not include the filing deadline period of the 20th through the 25th, over eight percent (about \$25,000) of the tax revenues received were via ACH debit. Fifteen percent of the returns filed during the early-filer period were done online, including the ever-

present zero-due return. What a significant reduction in recording and document retention time as well as filing errors! The Tax Division is anticipating an even better response in the filing deadline period.

For returns paid by the ACH debit method, the total cost including fees and staff time is only 55 cents per item. In comparison, the total cost of receiving, banking, recording and retaining a return by the traditional paper method averages \$3.94. The cost efficiency is obvious, but added benefits are that tax staff has more time to lavish on customers seeking assistance and to explore and develop further cost-saving customer service improvements. The naturally resulting better understanding of how to follow City tax and licensing rules and feeling of significant support will lead to a more positive business experience in Wheat Ridge to further the City's goals of being attractive to business.

The Wheat Ridge Greenbelt is greener...

...thanks to a \$4,000 grant from the Colorado Tree Coalition and Xcel Energy. Recently, more than 350 trees were planted along Clear Creek between Prospect Park and Kipling.



These trees along the Wheat Ridge Greenbelt are thirsty, and we're looking for some volunteers to water them on a regular basis through the rest of the summer.
